

<p>Christianity was founded by a man named Jesus thousands of years ago. He spread the word of God throughout the world and told his disciples about the religion of Christianity. Christians will remember Jesus by attending Church on a Sunday, and celebrating many festivals such as Christmas and Easter. Christmas is a time to remember when Jesus was born. Easter is a time to remember when Jesus was nailed to the cross and crucified by the Roman Empire. They didn't believe that he was the Son of God and instead called him a liar. All the teachings of Christianity can be found in one holy book called the Bible.</p> 	<p>Segregation – buses, schools, cinemas, cafes etc. This segregation was enforced by law – with a law for each aspect of life that was segregated.</p> <p>Paid less for jobs</p> <p>Subjected to violent attacks – sometimes</p> <p>Not allowed to vote – they were technically allowed to vote, but sometimes it was made very hard to do so, so many didn't bother.</p>	<p>Refused to give up her seat on the bus for a white passenger.</p> <p>Was arrested and fined \$10</p> <p>Her arrest led to the bus boycott – blacks walked to work, or shared taxis, but they refused to take the bus.</p> <p>Black people took part in Freedom Rides – they shared taxis and cars, and walked many miles to work, rather than use the buses.</p> <p>Eventually the bus company was ordered to end all segregation on buses and the boycott was a success</p> 	<p>Important civil rights leader</p> <p>He wanted to change the segregation that was happening in America at the time. Black people didn't have the same rights as white people. Martin Luther King wanted equality.</p> <p>Led the Bus Boycott of 1955-56 in Montgomery, Alabama</p> <p>Gave many inspirational speeches – “I have a dream” is the most famous, delivered at the march on Washington in August 1963.</p> <p>Was assassinated in April 1968 due to his beliefs about equality.</p>

<p>This question is an ultimate question as there isn't one distinct answer. Many people have various beliefs on what the purpose of life actually is. Your life purpose consists of the central motivating aims of your life—the reasons you get up in the morning. Purpose can guide life decisions, influence behaviour, shape goals, offer a sense of direction, and create meaning. For a Christian, their purpose in life would be to work for the good of others and gain their place in Heaven. However, a Buddhist may say their purpose in life is to stop suffering. As you can, this question is very subjective and heavily debated within today's world.</p> 	<p>All religions teach that war and fighting is wrong, as they teach that killing is wrong and only God has the right to take life, or that killing causes suffering and bad karma.</p> <p>Some religions, Islam, Christianity and Judaism allow war in certain circumstances so long as certain rules are followed. This idea is called a “just war”</p> <p>In Islam, there is an idea called jihad. This means struggle. The greater jihad is the daily struggle to be a good Muslim, to pray five times a day, to fast during Ramadan and to give to the poor. The lesser jihad is the struggle to defend Islam. This can involve fighting to defend Islam, but again certain rules must be followed, and peace should always be sought.</p>	<p>Islam was founded by a man named Muhammad who is known as a great prophet. His followers are named Muslims and can be found in all countries around the world. Muslims will worship in a mosque. Their holy book is named the Qur'an which is believed to be the words of Allah. For a Muslim, Allah is the all-powerful and all-knowing God. It is Allah who gives Muslims the rules for life. One important part of a Muslim's daily ritual is praying five times a day. The most important festival in the Muslim calendar is called Eid which celebrates the end of Ramadan (a period of fasting).</p> 	<p>Hijab means to dress modestly – it applies to men and women.</p> <p>Men and women should not show too much flesh.</p> <p>Some women wear headscarves – hijab – for the following reasons:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In the Qur'an it tells women to “draw a veil over your beauty” • It is a sign of royalty, historically • Women feel empowered when they wear it, as men are not focused on their looks, but their personalities. <p>It is their choice to wear it – no-one forces them to wear it. Some women chose to wear a veil called a niqab, which covered their face apart from their eyes.</p>
